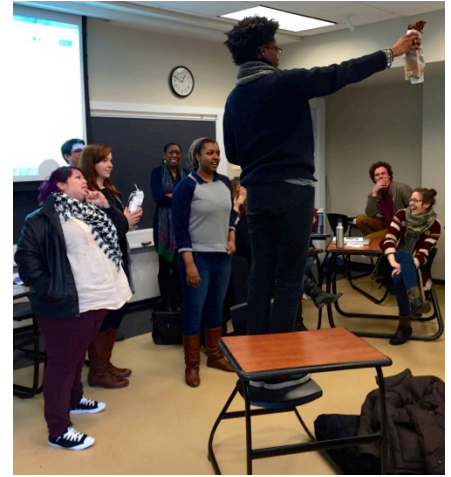

What is the certificate?

- ❖ The Graduate Certificate in Participatory Research (G CPR) is an **interdisciplinary** certificate program for graduate students at UNC Chapel Hill seeking training in the theoretical bases, rationale, methodologies, challenges, and motivations for carrying out **research** in equitable partnership **with** communities, instead of **on** communities.

Who is eligible?

- ❖ The Certificate is available to **all graduate students** across UNC. We have students from anthropology, public health, occupational therapy, religious studies, sociology, geography, history and more.
- ❖ Students can complete the certificate as part of their **master's** or **doctoral** degree program.

What does the certificate entail?

- ❖ It requires **10 hours of course credit** over the student's career.
